The demand for native plants over the years has increased substantially, especially for ecologically sourced plants.

There are an increasing number of large projects creating this demand, putting pressure on nurseries to keep up with demand.

For people needing plants, there's a requirement for forward planning and ordering of plants well in advance (1-2 years) prior to project commencing.

This ensures that you get the plant species and numbers required.

This also helps nurseries supplying plants with production planning.

Based in Auckland's North, Kaipātiki Project is a **not-for-profit, community organisation** inspiring people to *share in nature's revival* and *live lightly on our planet*.

WHY order native plants

Restore native plant habitat

- Even though threatened native plants tend to fly under the radar, they are still under threat
- By planting native plants, you are preserving biodiversity
- By choosing natives, you are promoting stewardship of our natural heritage

Support native wildlife & balance NZ ecosystem

- Our native wildlife is under threat due to loss of habitat through urban development
- When their habitats are restored, they can pollinate flowers, help control pests and increase biodiversity

Eco-sourced plants guidelines

- Auckland Unitary Plan Guidelines specify to source plants from the Ecological District (i.e. eco-sourcing)
- Eco-sourced plants survive and adapt better to local conditions
- Plants of the same species but sourced from different localities vary in characteristics, including growth rate and tolerance of environmental conditions

Putaputaweta, Coprosma varieties, Korokio, Broom, Ake ake, Hangehange, Kumerahou, Manuka, Kawakawa, Wharangi, Mahoe, Makaka and more.

GROUNDCOVER



Rengarenga, Wharawhara, Ti Rauriki, Turutu, Parataniwha, Creeping Fuchsia, Toatoa, Bachelors button, Mikoikoi, Panakanake and more.

GRASSES



A range of Carex varieties, Pūreirei/Pukio, Umbrella sedge, Cutty Grass and Oioi.

HARAKEKE



Wharariki and Harakeke.

FERNS



Hen & Chicken fern and Ponga-Silver fern.

CLIMBERS



Puawhananga, Pohuehue, Kaihua, Kareao and Tataramoā.

PALMS



Nikau.

OUR PLANT'S JOURNEY: From a seed collected locally, each plant is on average handled 8-times to grow it to this size and be kept weed-free and healthy. No 'imperfect looking' plants are removed to ensure genetic diversity. We recycle pots to save them going to landfill, and work organically with no weed retardant or pesticides in the soil.

Native plant journey

YOUR PLANT'S JOURNEY

Plants grown at Kaipātiki Project are special, and so is their journey.

- From a seed collected locally, volunteers have handled your plant on average 8 times to grow it to this size and keep it weed-free and healthy.
- We do not remove plants that don't look perfect (like commercial nurseries do) – this ensures genetic diversity in the plants, which is good for the overall health of the species.
- Volunteers from all walks of life have grown this plant; attendees at plant propagation workshops, international students and new migrants, people with disabilities, teams of work-mates, those in-between jobs or striving for a new career in horticulture, or people simply with time on their hands sharing their passion for plants together.
- We recycle pots to save them going to landfill, so excuse us if some have a 'lived-in' look and come in all shapes and sizes.
- We work organically with no weed retardant or pesticides in the soil – the odd weed or snail may have escaped – just remove before planting.
- This plant is hardy and healthy. It will thrive if planted in the right place at the right time, just ask if unsure.


